Faith—Personal, but Not Meant to be Private

At various training events over recent months, people have commented that the questions about faith we have had before us, are either "not Lutheran" or are too personal/private. This reminds me of my early learnings that it is bad manners to talk about religion, money, or politics. It seems that this perspective is still strong here in Wisconsin, at least more so than other places I have lived, and I have to admit that I had not considered this so didn't prepare people well for the activities I had influence over.

My own faith understanding was reshaped when, as a young adult, I lived in Oregon at a time it was the most unchurched state in the nation, and my county of residence, reportedly the most unchurched county in the state. It wasn't an instant transformation to be able to recognize the importance of speaking and embodying faith (albeit in a "Lutheran key") in daily life. Nor was it quick to recognize what it means to think of the immediate neighborhood is equally as important a mission field as one you might find anywhere around the world, but my pastors' persistent and consistent efforts to help us/me rethink what it means to be Christian in today's world, paid off. In time, my paradigms about religion began to shift—probably more correct to say "flipped", such was the dramatic change of understanding in me. In years since, I'd forgotten how dissonant and uncomfortable this perspective might sound to others, so I've been surprised at times, by people's responses.

Faith is a deeply personal matter at a profound level, even while paradoxically according to scriptural evidence, we are to practice our faith amongst others of faith and provide witness to others outside the faith. From ancient times, God has intended blessing to God's chosen people to in turn bless others (i.e., "the nations"). And so faith is not to be private, it must be lived and spoken. For, as Paul says in Romans 10:

14 But how are they to call on one in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in one of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone to proclaim him? 15 And how are they to proclaim him unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!" 17 So faith comes from what is heard, and what is heard comes through the word of Christ. [

If we as the Church are unable to speak of God's importance to us, Jesus' impact upon our lives, or the ways in which we feel the Holy Spirit move in and through us, how will those who do not know come to know? How will this people that we are as the ELCA, be able to survive and participate in God's mission as we have been invited to do, if we cannot speak of God's overwhelming love for us as shown most emphatically through Jesus Christ? Have you considered how, as the ELCA, we see God's grace with a particular lens that reminds us that we are beloved and forgiven no because of what we do or don't do, but because it is God's action—God's intention for being in relationship with us. We read scripture in a way that expects God to keep speaking to us through the Living Word. There are people deeply hurt by their interactions with church and in life, for whom our perspectives can bring broken people healing and wholeness. But how can those who do not know, come to know, if others won't share the good news? How beautiful are the feet of those who bring the good news!

But knowing this need to live and speak faith, countering a lifetime of messaging that favors quiet and private faith, is not something most people can move to without a time of discomfort, nor is the transition a quick one. Even to speak to those we have known and worshipped with for years of such matters, will feel awkward, and there will be fear that translates into resistance. As people of God entrusted with a role to play in God's mission, we do need to start—even knowing our efforts will sometimes be "messy." Know that when we share of having less than perfect faith—one occasioned by doubts and failures—our witness will have more impact in the authenticity and vulnerability we share, than any perfectly scripted testimony of faith. It's not about "getting it right" but of trusting God to make what we say right for the circumstances we are in.

Intentionally working to grow in our ability to speak our faith, as well as to live it, is essential to our church's survival and ability do the part of God's mission that we've had entrusted to us as God's people. God's mission will be carried out even if we do not respond to God's invitation to participate; however, we *are invited* to participate. It's a life or death matter for us that we do respond and share the good news!

To become more comfortable (even confident!) and noticing of opportunities where our words of faith are invited by God, we need to practice! We can practice noticing those moments by looking for them, even before we are comfortable responding to them. And we can practice talking with one another in our congregations and at other faith gatherings. And we need to move beyond telling only the "pretty stories" of faith, to share from our own broken times, and how God has come to us through others, how our lives have been turned around. If you need encouragement or equipping to move into your calling to proclaim the good news of God in Jesus Christ, let me know. I would be honored to be invited to walk this journey of faith with you.

Again, but this time from Isaiah: ⁷ How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of the messenger who announces peace, who brings good news, who announces salvation, who says to Zion, "Your God reigns." Isaiah 52:7 (NRSV) May your feet be seen beautifully going forth.

Chicken, Spinach, and Cheese Pasta Bake

Ingredients

- 1 (8 ounce) package penne pasta
- 1 teaspoon olive oil
- 1 onion, chopped
- 3 cups chopped cooked chicken
- 1 (14 ounce) can Italian-style diced tomatoes
- 1 (10 ounce) package spinach
- 1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese, softened
- 1 1/2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C).
- 2. Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil; add penne and cook, stirring occasionally, until tender yet firm to the bite, about 11 minutes. Drain.
- 3. Heat olive oil in a skillet over medium-high heat. Saute onion in hot oil until tender, 5 to 7 minutes.
- 4. Mix penne pasta, onion, chicken, diced tomatoes, spinach, and cream cheese together in a baking dish until the cream cheese melts and coats everything. Sprinkle mozzarella cheese over the pasta mixture. Cover baking dish with aluminum foil.
- 5. Bake in the preheated oven for 30 minutes. Remove foil and continue baking until heated through and beginning to brown along the edges, about 15 minutes more.
